# GEORGE L. CLAFLEN, JR. FAIA, LEED AP Principal-in-charge

George L. Claflen, Jr. FAIA, is an architect, urban designer and teacher who has practiced in Philadelphia for more than thirty years. He was a professor of Architecture at Temple University for thirty years where he was the chair of the program from 1983 to 1989. He was president of the American Institute of Architects, Philadelphia Chapter in 1997 and was elected a fellow of the American Institute of Architects in 1999. He has worked for firms in London, England, Cambridge, MA, New Jersey, and Philadelphia. In the public sector he has worked for the City of San Francisco Planning Department and the United States Environmental Protection Agency Region III.

He has designed four educational projects including two on the Navajo Indian reservation in Arizona that were the culmination of extensive community dialogue and programming research. His firm, Claflen Associates, has completed the renovation of a 47 unit housing project in South Coatesville, PA, for The Community Builders, numerous assignments for the EPA, including their first "green lease" document, and several residences including three condominiums on Rittenhouse Square. The firm has completed a 46,000 SF multi-use building for CORA Services, a non-profit engaged in school and community counseling activities in Northeast Philadelphia. It prepared a building feasibility plan for Congreso des Latinos Unidos that resulted in a new headquarters and is now working for the City of Philadelphia on numerous projects that have included the new video camera monitoring facility at Police Headquarters.

He has worked closely with the staff of the Philadelphia City Planning Commission on the Center City parking study and the recent evaluation of the Waterfront Redevelopment District zoning provisions as implemented along the North Delaware Waterfront. The firm is urban design consultant to the Philadelphia Zoning Code Commission consulting team.

George is a founding member of the Design Advocacy Group of Philadelphia (DAG). He compiled and edited DAG's Reform

Agenda for Planning and Design Review in Philadelphia and participated in the Building Industry Association project partially funded by the William Penn Foundation that articulated the case for zoning reform. He is also a steering committee member of the MIT Enterprise Forum in Philadelphia.
